Due to IORD efforts, the phrase - rare diseases is no longer foreign in India. IORD brought pharma industry, patients, health, science & technology, chemicals ministries of India, to have a dialog to raise the awareness, and to have road map for Indian orphan drug act through several workshops and conferences. Due to IORD efforts, leading policy makers such as former president of India has become spokespersons for rare diseases cause in India. IORD is member of EURORDIS, APARDO, CORD, NORD, NZORD, ICORD, Rare Voices Au and a full member of RDI.
